Renovating Central Museum

Central Museum of Nagpur city was established in 1863 to show-case the cultural heritage of Central India. The collections of the museum were divided into six sections viz. Art and Industry, Archaeology, Anthropology, Natural History, Paintings and Geology. It is a learning place for young students of entire Central India and prominent visiting place of Nagpur city.

During my school days in seventies I had a knowledge fulfilling visit to this museum. Few days back, as a senior citizen, I visited the museum again to answer my curiosity to know what changes and additions have been incorporated during all these years. My observation is that the Heritage Section, comprising of Ancient Heritage Gallery and Nagpur Heritage Gallery, has come up nicely in the Central Museum. Ancient Heritage Gallery depicts photographs and relevant information of major heritage sites of entire Vidarbha region. Nagpur Heritage Gallery depicts photographs of articles used by Father of Indian Constitution, Bharat Ratna Dr B.R. Ambedkar and rulers of Bhonsale clan. The articles of Babasaheb would be $show cased in Ambedkar \, Museum \, being \, built \, in \, Chicholi \, about$ 25 kms from Nagpur on Katol Road..

But the Anthropology and Geology sections are weakly represented in the museum. It may be mentioned here that Anthropological Survey of India and Geological Survey of India have their own keenly developed museums in their respective office premises in Nagpur city. The museums of these offices are visited by school and college students only during their foundation day. For rest of the year these museums remain in isolation. The officials of the Central Museum may therefore approach these offices to acquire more number of anthropological and geological specimens. Proactive steps by these two offices to showcase more and more specimens in Central Museum would definitely raise the satisfaction level of visitors. Beautiful Zeolite specimens, models of dinosaur eggs from GSI would definitely be the added attractions.

Secondly, the single-storied Central Museum has to be made multi-storied to accommodate more sections worth seeing. The museum should have a hall for showing our cultural heritage videos and documentaries.

The Department of Cultural Affairs, Directorate of Archaeology and Museums, Govt. of Maharashtra, in coordination with the Heritage Conservation Committee and experts from Archaeological Survey of India, Anthropological Survey of India, Geological Survey of India, etc. may upgrade the existing Central Museum to a State-of-the-Art Museum for the benefit of the entire Central India.
